Students must earn a grade of "C" or better to earn transfer credit for each course.

- 1. Providence College SCE will waive the \$55 application fee for students who meet the above requirements.
- 2. Students must fulfill the Providence College SCE's core curriculum requirements; complete the residency requirement of a minimum of 45 credits in Providence College SCE; and earn at least 50% of their major credits with Providence College SCE coursework.
- Most students transferring with the Associate's in General Studies will need 60 credits to complete the bachelor's degree.
